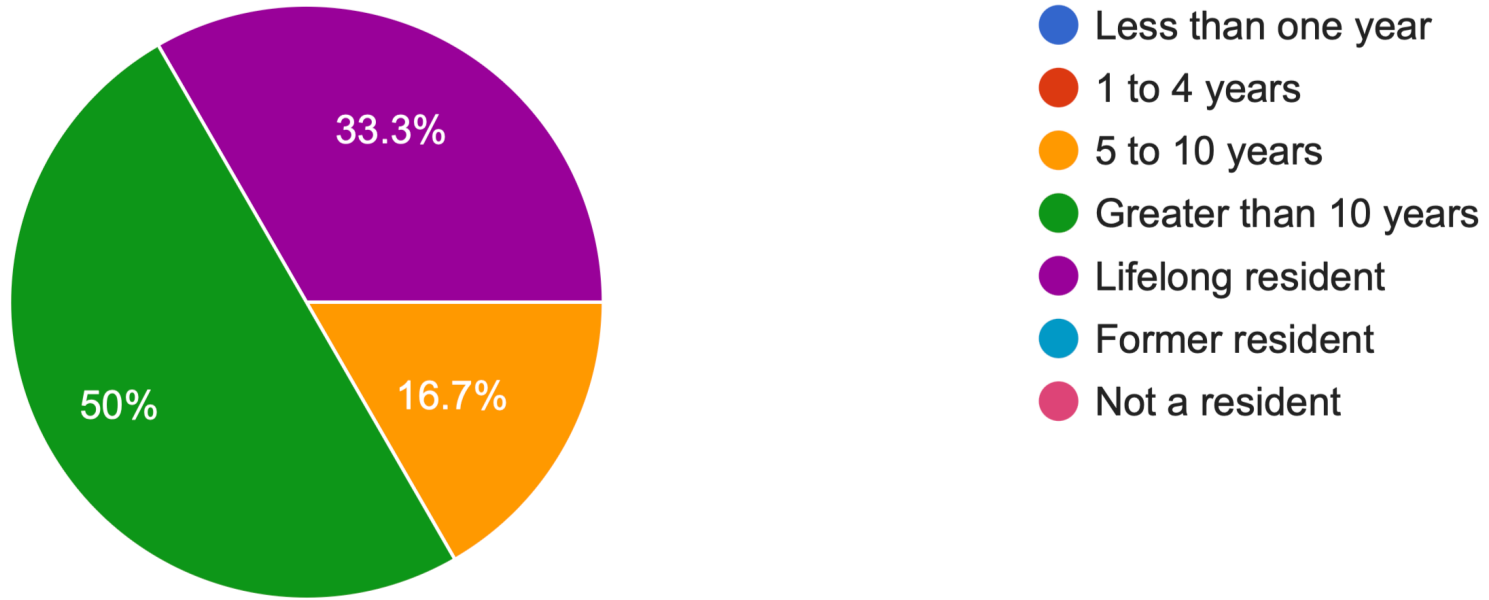


1. How long have you lived in the City of Dorris?

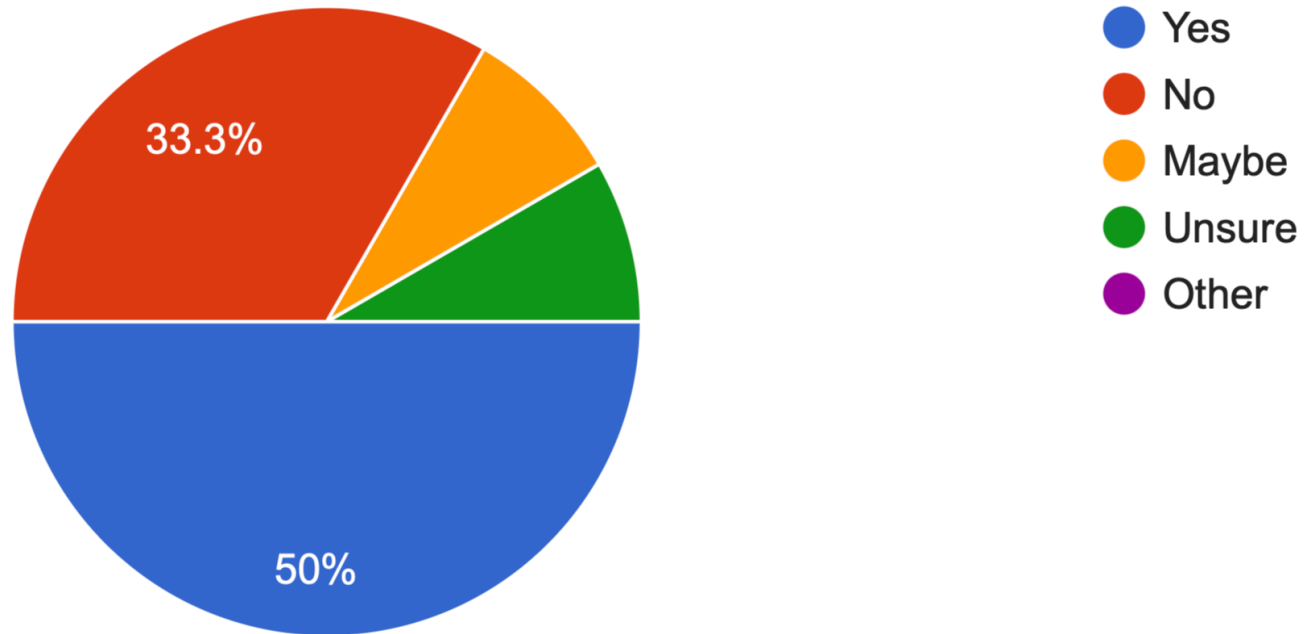

5. Yes, I like living in Dorris. I am content with the fact we are not growing at a rapid pace, i.e., status quo is fine with me.

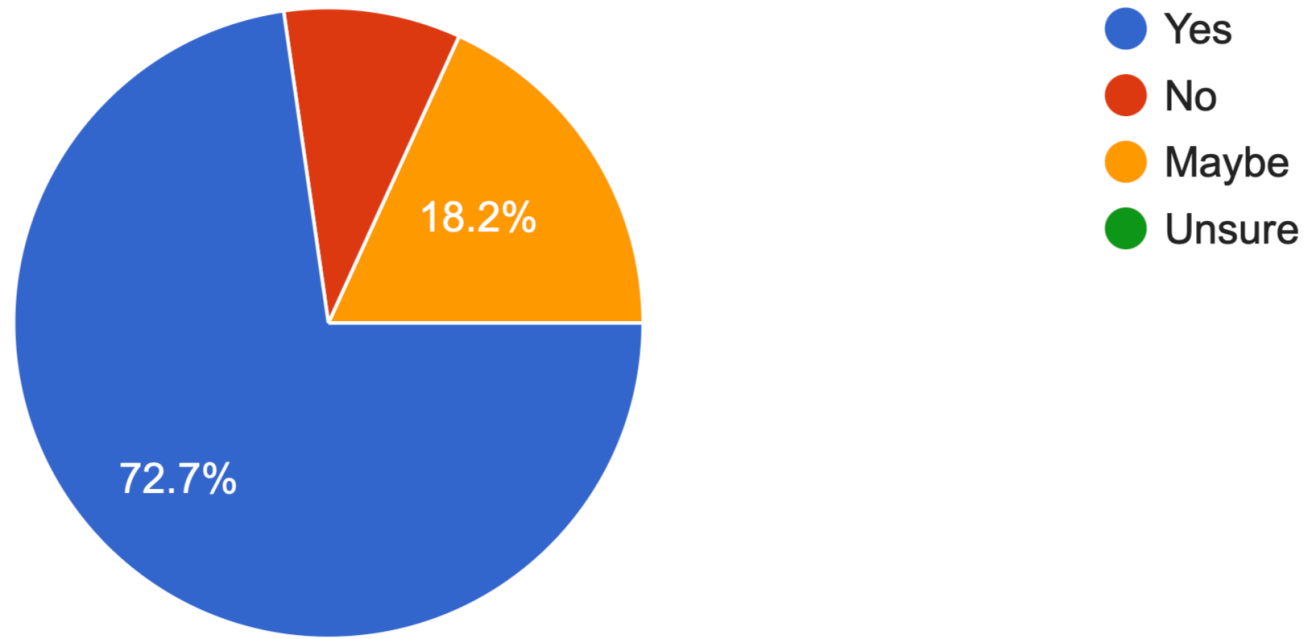
6. What is the most positive change the City of Dorris has experienced in the time you have lived here or have been visiting?

7. I think that the museum is doing a good job of preserving Dorris. I would like to see more people participate by becoming members of the museum and its board.

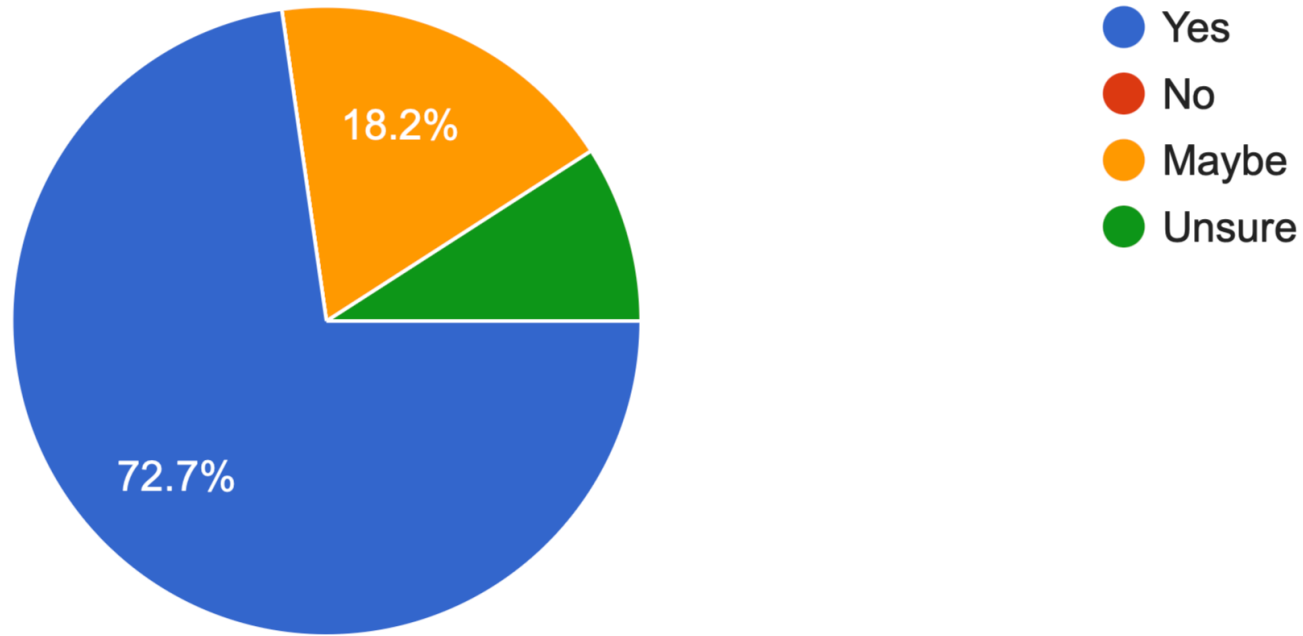
10. What aspects of the City of Dorris would you change in the future?

11. How would you describe the City of Dorris to someone who has not visited the area before?

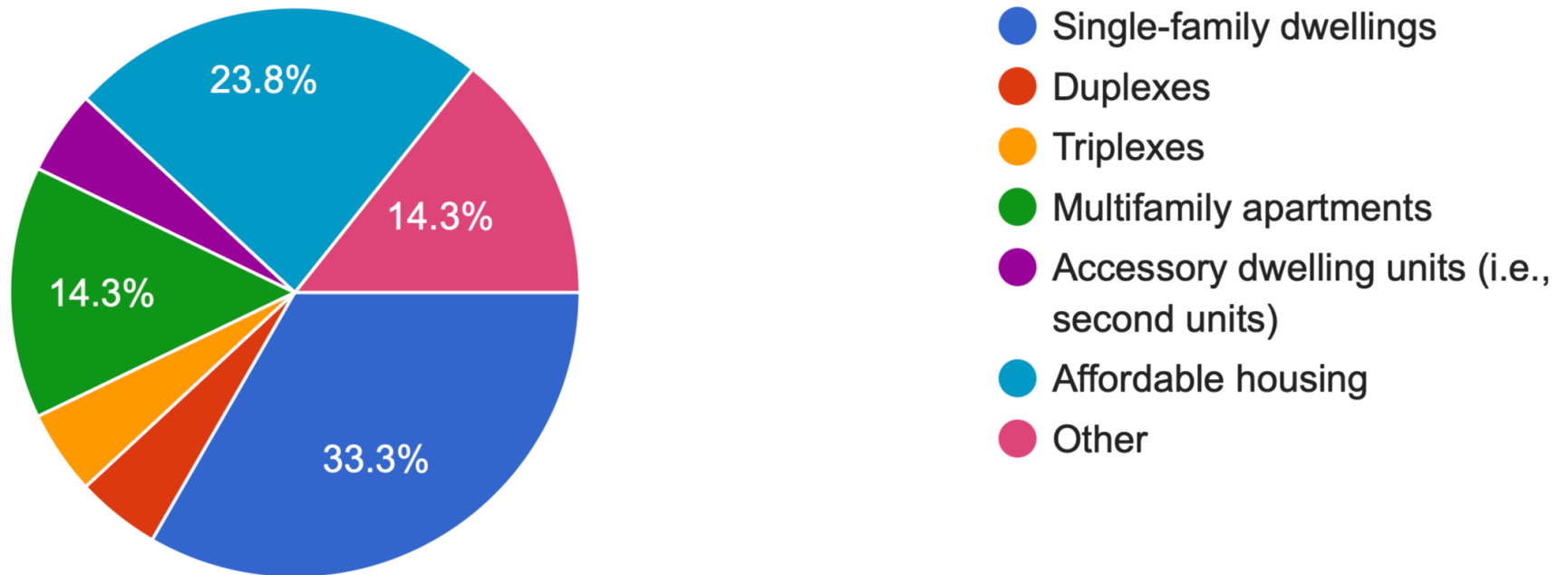
1. Small town feel.

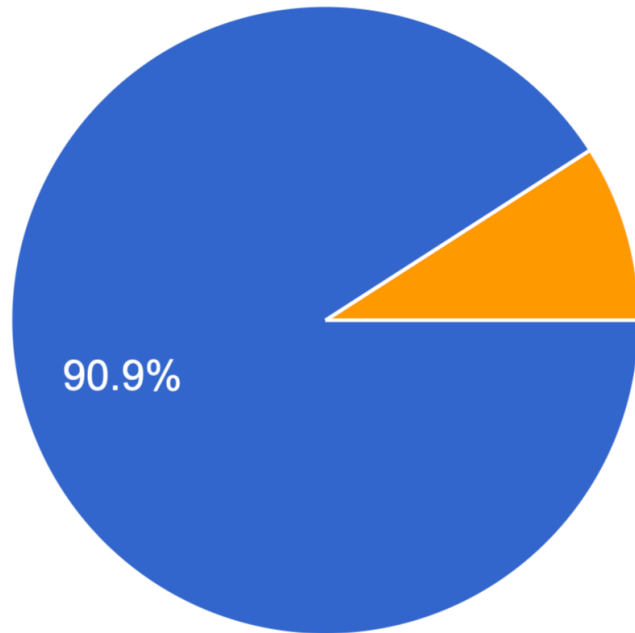

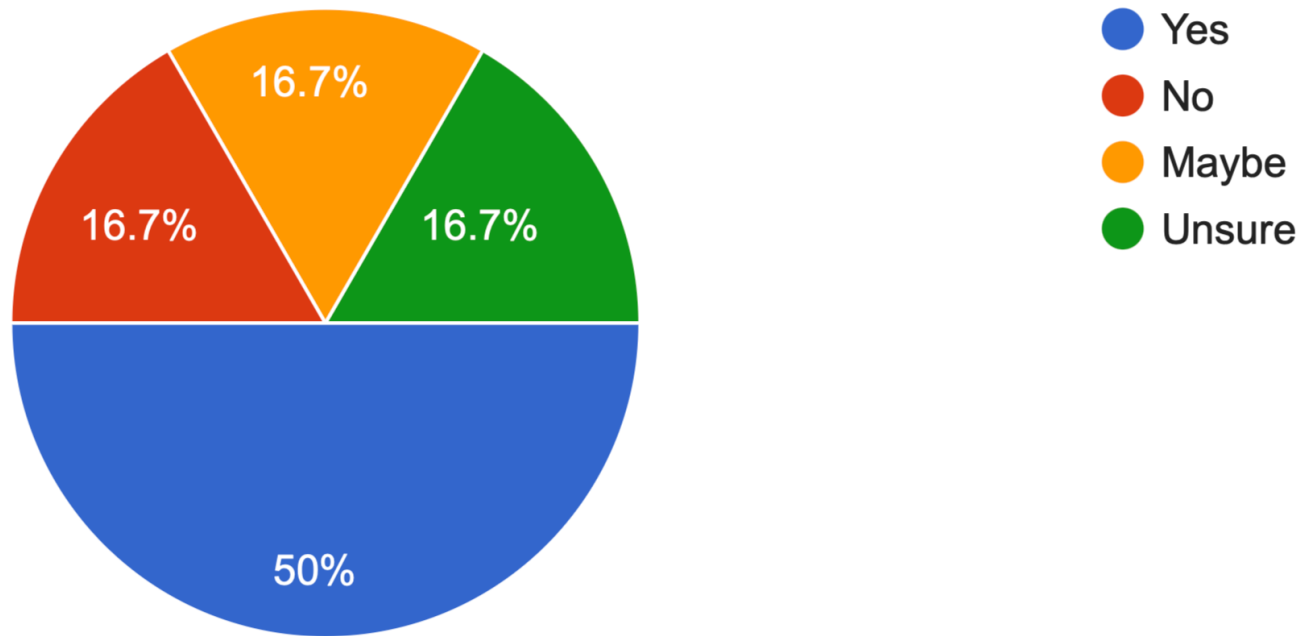

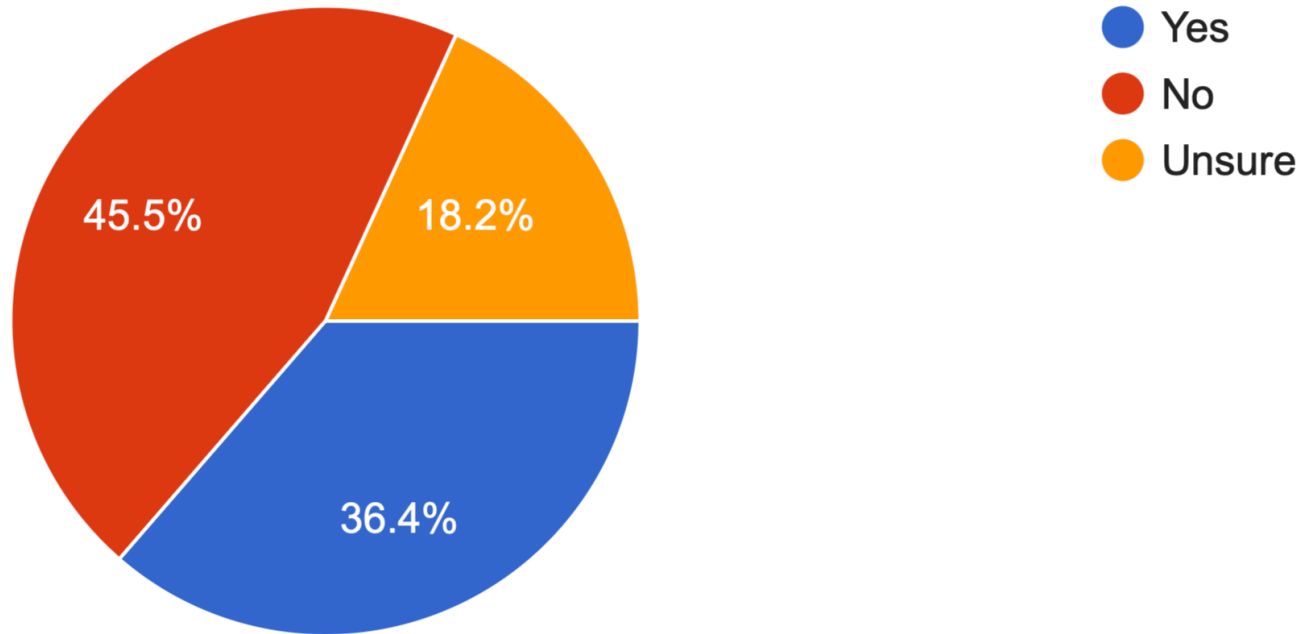

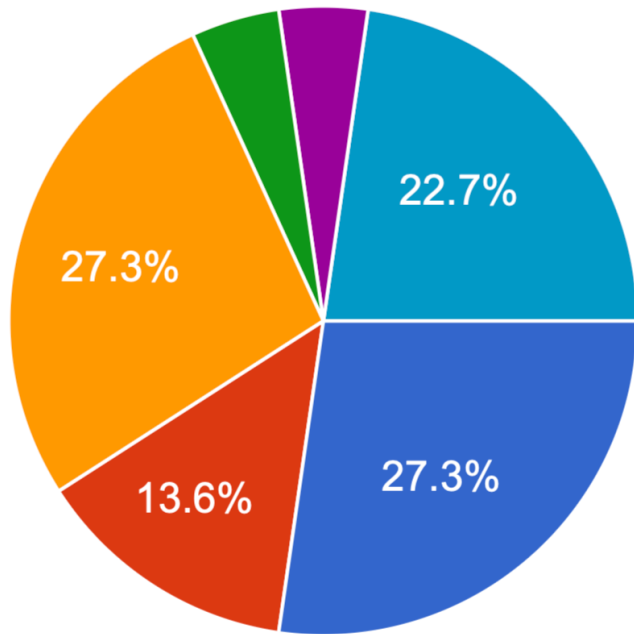
1. Lack of law enforcement during nighttime.
